The Col commanding would call the attention of first sergeants to the fact that there is great lack of promptness in furnishing details called for by the Adjunct. Non-commissioned officers acting in such capacities are unfit to hold their rank.

Corporal Hugh Park Co "E" is promoted to the position made vacant by the reduction of Sergt William Zeigler - The commanding officer would also call the attention of the men to the prevailing practice of leaving the trimming of their clothing off - This is not only contrary to military discipline but shows that they do not appreciate the name they have earned and forget that the 155th Penna Zouaves stands high in the estimation of the people at home as well as in other brigades. It is to be hoped that this bad practice will not be resorted to again.

Company commanders must give their personal attention to this matter and compel obedience to this order - a non-commissioned officer who has not pride enough to keep himself clean, and his uniform in good order thereby setting an example to the men is unfit to hold any position - Instructions will be given to sergeants who make details for guard (duty), that the men so detailed must be instructed in their duties. A man who does not know how to salute and officer promptly is unfit for guard duty such men must be drilled by the sergeants.

Private Lewis was absent from August 18th to August 19th keeping himself hid until the company to which he belongs had returned from picket, when he made his appearance - after the work had been done.

These men are not the only ones who have been guilty of straggling, but only to the leniency of their company officers they have not been brought to trail. Hereafter charges will be brought against all such offenders, and the full extent of the law will be meted out of them.

It is hoped that the men of this command will sustain the good reputation of the regiment by always being up with their companies.
